WHAT ARE THEY GOOD FOR?
ABSOLUTELY EVERYTHING!

MODERATE FLOODING
Wetlands act as a sponge on the landscape soaking up excess stormwater, preventing it from swelling our streams and rivers.

FILTERING POLLUTION
Wetlands are great for turning excess nutrients into standing plants, thus preventing the pollution from turning our streams and lakes pea soup green with algae and out of control plants.

WILDLIFE HABITAT
Ducks, frogs, salamanders, deer, song birds, fish! You name the animal and they probably use and depend on wetlands at some point during the year!

GROUNDWATER RECHARGE
By filtering water and soaking it up like a sponge, wetlands recharge our groundwater supplies with fresh water. Wetlands can also lessen the effects of drought conditions by storing water from the wet portions of the year.
